

# Friends of the Pickens Library

The 2016 Community Used Book Sale will be Thursday, Friday and Saturday October 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> at Chattahoochee Technical College. The Thursday sale will be from 4 p.m. until 6 p.m. for members of The Friends of The Pickens Library. The Thursday sale will give members an opportunity to preview and shop prior to the general public. The annual membership is \$15 for an individual or \$30 for a family. You can join or renew your membership at <a href="www.friendsofpickenslibrary.org/membership/">www.friendsofpickenslibrary.org/membership/</a>, or at the door. Applications are also available at the library. The hours for the public sale are Friday 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Prices will be \$.50 and up for paperbacks and \$1.00 and up for hardbacks.

The last few years the sale has generated over \$5000 which along with grants from the Pickens County Community Resources Association are the largest sources of income for the library. This money is used to keep books and materials in the library current.

The sale is a yearlong endeavor; two weeks after last year's sale the library had 20 boxes of books to be picked up for this year's sale. Last year we had more than 12,000 books and over 800 volunteer hours with most of those hours in the week or two leading up to the sale. If you are available to help move, sort books or work at the sale please notify Jim Hughes, jjhughes@windstream.net. If you have books to donate, especially children's books, they can be dropped off at the library during business hours. The library does some preliminary sorting then boxes up the books for pickup, they are then stored until the weeks before the sale and moved to the college. We currently have more than 300 boxes of books stored at two locations.

This year we will again be accepting credit cards for book purchases. You can use your Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express. Unsold books are donated to Pickens Animal Rescue, Women's Prison Ministry, Habitat for Humanity, and the Salvation Army.






"Forsyth County, Georgia, at the turn of the twentieth century was home to a large African American community that included ministers and teachers, farmers and field hands, tradesmen, servants, and children. Many black residents were poor sharecroppers, but others owned their own farms and the land on which they'd founded the county's thriving black churches. But then in September of 1912, three young black laborers were accused of raping and murdering a white girl. Soon bands of white 'night riders' launched a coordinated campaign of arson and terror, driving all 1,098 black citizens out of the county. In the wake of the expulsions, whites harvested the crops and took over the livestock of their former neighbors, and quietly laid claim to 'abandoned' land. The charred ruins of homes and churches disappeared into the weeds, until the people and places of black Forsyth were forgotten, as locals kept Forsyth 'all white' well into the 1990s. Blood at the Root is a sweeping American tale that spans the Cherokee removals of the 1830s, the hope and promise of Reconstruction, and the crushing injustice of Forsyth's racial cleansing. With bold storytelling and lyrical prose, Phillips breaks a century-long silence and uncovers a history of racial terrorism that continues to shape America in the twenty-first century."

## 2016 Book Sale Dates


The Friends 2016 book sale will be held on October 28 and 29 at Chattahoochee Tech in Jasper.

The close-knit Quinn siblings enjoyed the kind of idyllic childhood that seems made for greeting cards, spending each summer at Whit's End, the family's home on Cape Cod.
